



- Charismatic Prime Minister



Global Outlook

- China's economic outlook will be slowest in 25 years
- Deep recessions have occurred in Russia and Brazil
- Major conflicts persist: Ukraine, South China Sea, Middle East, Korea
- TPP, Iran Nuclear Deal, Climate Change Accord under threat
- IMF predicts global economic growth will be "disappointing"
- West will reel under divergent policies; US leadership will be in transition through mid 2017
- Europe faces social unrest; BREXIT looms over UK
- India's economy is the bright spot

- World's largest free-market democracy
- 1.3 billion people
- Largest Producer of Milk globally; Advanced Manufacturing prowess; Information Technology powerhouse
- 7.3% Growth in 2017 (OECD); Infrastructure is key
- Extremely young and capable workforce, insisting on development
- Stable politics at the Center an understatement!
- 29 Indian States; Competitive Federalism driving progress
- Strong U.S.-India bilateral ties underpinning opportunity for investment

The Modi Administration – First 1000 Days

- Insurance FDI increased to 49% strongest signal for investors
- Unique Identity JAM Trio: enhancing Targeted Delivery of Services
- Bankruptcy Law passed, enabling banks to manage NPAs
- Nuclear Energy Insurance Pool created; Target of 20,000 MWs in 10 yrs
- Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor serves as replicable model
- Mars Orbital Spacecraft launched successfully a 1st for Asia!
- Defense FDI increased to 49%; 100 Smart Cities program launched
- Demonetization focused on cleaning up elections, tax evasion, terror





India Corporates' Debt Burden = Opportunity



- Pan India \$74 Bn of NPAs
- GVK-owned Mumbai Airport; Bengaluru; Bali
- GVK to deleverage \$500 Mn
- Numerous similar examples

\$4.2 Bn Supply by GE of 1000 Locomotives



- \$200 Mn Factory to be built in Marhowra in Bihar
- Maintenance Facilities to be constructed at Bhatinda in Punjab and Gandhidham in Gujarat
- Dynamic Railways Minister Suresh Prabhu

Cold Chain Storage



- USD 13 Bn by 2018
- Existing cold chain storage facilities, 95% under private management
- Bharti and Reliance to become biggest players; both groups are accessible

Crystal Ball - Reforms Coming in 2017-2018

- Rationalization of Taxation Pan-India Implementation of GST
- Subsidy Reforms: Cooking Gas, Kerosene, and Petrol have seen progress – Fertilizer & Natural Gas still to come
- **■** Fiscal Federalism: Continue to transfer authority to States
- Labor Reform is necessary to unshackle companies and attract investment
- Land Reform Scrap UPA Law, Return Authority to States
- Opening of Retail Sector
- Deepening of High Tech Collaboration in Defense, Homeland Security, Energy
